THE RUMOR MILL

Rumor: Catfish sting with their whiskers.

Reality: All catfish and bullheads have four pairs of whiskers, or barbels, lined with sensitive nerve endings, similar to taste buds. They allow the fish to taste and smell its way through dark and muddy water where it hunts for food. The sting many anglers have felt comes from the sharp spine on the leading edge of the dorsal fin and two pectoral fins. When alarmed, the fish raises and locks these spiked fins in an upright position. A catfish can't actually stab with these fins, but if you grab one carelessly you can poke yourself. It's no different from getting poked by a bluegill and, as with other sharp-spined fish, the puncture often gets infected, causing it to smart for several days. There is no venom in the spine of the catfish or bullheads anglers catch. However, one member of the catfish family does have venomous spines. The madtoms -such as the tadpole madtom, checkered madtom, and stome cat-are tiny minnow-sized catfish that grow only a few inches long. Madtoms are the only fish in Minnesota that have poison glands. When attacked, a madtom can inject its venom through the spines in its fins into the mouth of a predator. Although deadly to a fish, the venom is no more dangerous to humans than a mild bee sting. To hold a catfish or bullhead, place your palm on its belly and slide your thumb under one pectoral fin and your forefinger over and index finger under the other pectoral fin. You can also hold a madtom safely in the cup of your palm. Just don't squeeze.

MINNESOTA CONSIDERS WALLEYE SLOT LIMITS

A three year study on Minnesota's Big Sand Lake has shown that a special possession limit had no identifiable impact on the lake's walleye and northern pike populations. The experimental limit allowed possession of only one walleye over 20 inches in a limit of six fish, and only one northern over 24 inches in a limit of three fish. Biologists hoped to see an increase in fish size or overall abundance of walleyes and northerns after the limit was imposed. Despite the experimental regulation, the average fish size in Big Sand, a popular walleye destination in northern Minnesota, has slipped in recent years. The department of natural resources is now proposing a slot limit where anglers would be required to release all walleyes from 18 to 26 inches. Also only one walleye over 26 inches could be included in a bag limit.


